




The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health [plan](#). The SBC shows you how you and the [plan](#) would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about the cost of this [plan](#) (called the [premium](#)) will be provided separately. This is only a summary.** For more information about your coverage, or to get a copy of the complete terms of coverage, contact your Human Resources department. Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	For network providers \$5,000 Individual / \$10,000 Family; For out-of-network providers \$7,000 Individual / \$14,000 Family Maximum that any one person will satisfy toward the annual family deductible: \$5,000 Individual / \$7,000 Family	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the calendar year deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the plan , each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of deductible expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family deductible .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Yes. Preventive care services are covered before you meet your deductible .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services without cost-sharing and before you meet your deductible . See a list of covered preventive services at https://www.healthcare.gov/coverage/preventive-care-benefits/ .
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	No	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	For network providers \$6,900 Individual / \$13,800 Family For out-of-network providers \$14,000 Individual / \$28,000 Family Maximum that any one person will satisfy toward the annual family out of pocket limit: \$6,900 Individual / \$14,000 Family	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a calendar year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums , balance-billed charges, ineligible charges and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .
Will you pay less if you use a network provider ?	Yes. You have a choice of Network. See www.consociate.com or call 1-877-752-3937 for a list of network providers .	This plan uses a provider network . You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network . You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider , and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware, your network provider might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.

Does this [plan](#) provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

This is not a cost estimator. Treatments shown are just examples of how this [plan](#) might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your [providers](#) charge, and many other factors. Focus on the [cost-sharing](#) amounts ([deductibles](#), [copayments](#) and [coinsurance](#)) and [excluded services](#) under the [plan](#). Peg is Having a Baby

(9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

(a year of routine in-network care of a well-controlled condition)

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In this example, Joe would pay:

<i>What isn't covered</i>

The total Joe would pay is	\$1,500

Mia's Simple Fracture

(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- The [plan's](#) overall [deductible](#) \$5,000
- [ER coinsurance](#) 20%
- Hospital (facility) [coinsurance](#) 20%
- Other [coinsurance](#) 20%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:

[Emergency room care](#) (*including medical supplies*)
[Diagnostic test](#) (*x-ray*)
[Durable medical equipment](#) (*crutches*)
[Rehabilitation services](#) (*physical therapy*)

Total Example Cost	\$2,800
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In this example, Mia would pay:

The total Mia would pay is	\$2,800
